Important

You may only use this form if you currently hold a:

- Contributory Parent (Temporary) (Class UT) visa *and* you are applying for a Contributory Parent (Migrant) (Class CA) visa, or
- Contributory Aged Parent (Temporary) (Class UU) visa *and* you are applying for a Contributory Aged Parent (Residence) (Class DG) visa.

If you are applying for any other parent visa, you **cannot use this form – you must use a form 47PA Application for migration to Australia by a parent.**

Before filling in the form

Make sure you have **all the required documents.**

A new sponsorship form (form 40 *Sponsorship for migration to Australia*) needs to be completed in all circumstances, unless the person who sponsored you for your temporary parent visa application has died and there is no other sponsor available.

Making a valid application

To make a valid application:

- you must be the holder of a
 - Contributory Parent (Temporary) (Class UT) visa, or
 - Contributory Aged Parent (Temporary) (Class UU) visa;
- use this form (available from the department's website, any Australian mission or office of the department in Australia);
- provide the address of where you intend to live while your application is being processed. Failure to give your residential address in this application will result in your application being invalid. A post office box address will not be accepted as your residential address;
- pay the required charge;
- attach any documentation you are required to provide with your application; and
- lodge your application at the appropriate office (see below).

Where to lodge your application

Contributory Parent (Migrant) (Class CA) visa applications from applicants who are **outside Australia** at the time of application must be lodged at the **Perth Offshore Parents Centre (POPC)**. Such applications cannot be lodged at any Australian mission and must be lodged as follows:

If you are **in Australia** at the time of application and are eligible to apply on this form, you can lodge your application at any office of the department in Australia. Addresses are listed at Part 3 of booklet 3, *Parent Migration* or can be found on the department's website www.immi.gov.au/allforms/

You must also:

- complete the form in English;
- answer all questions truthfully; and
- provide supporting documents where necessary.

If you provide incorrect information or documents, this may affect whether you are granted a visa or not, or your visa may be subsequently cancelled.

Read the notes on each question. If a question is not applicable, write 'N/A'. Any changes or corrections you make must be initialled and dated by each person who signs the form. If you use the page provided in the form (**Part H Additional information**) or any other sheets of paper for additional information, each page must also be signed and dated by all persons who sign the form.

Method of payment

Payment of the required charge must accompany your application and is generally not refunded if the application is unsuccessful. To make a payment, please pay by credit card, debit card or by bank cheque made payable to the 'Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs'. **Please do not pay by cash or personal cheque.**

For clients applying for a parent visa that can be granted outside Australia, please pay in Australian dollars (A\$) by credit card or international bank cheque (drawn on an Australian bank or drawn on a bank that has representation in Australia) made payable to the 'Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs'. Send payment with your application to POPC. If you intend paying by credit card, please provide details in **Part O Payment details**. **Please do not pay by cash or personal cheque.**

Who the form covers

The application form covers a family unit, namely a main applicant and, if applicable, spouse and dependants.

Spouse, dependent children and other dependants

You should not include a spouse or dependants in this application unless they also hold a Contributory Parent (Temporary) (Class UT) visa or a Contributory Aged Parent (Temporary) (Class UU) visa. The only exception is where a child has been born to you, or someone included in your temporary visa application, after the grant of the temporary visa.

Custody requirement

The department will seek to ensure that allowing a child to migrate is not in contravention of Australia's international obligations in relation to the prevention of child abduction. If your application includes a child under 18 and the child's other parent is not migrating with you or there is any other person who has the legal right to determine where the child can live, you will need to provide a statutory declaration from each of them giving permission for the child to migrate. Alternatively, you can provide a certified copy of a valid court order showing that you/your spouse has the legal right to remove the child from the country.

Supporting documents

The documents you must provide are listed in **Part P Checklist** of your application. Enclose all documents with your application. You may be asked to provide other documents during processing.

'Certified copies' of documents mean copies authorised or stamped as being true copies of originals by a person or agency recognised by the law of your country. In Australia, they must be certified by a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner for Declarations or by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made.

All documents not in English must be accompanied by a certified English translation of the original. You may be asked to provide the originals of your documents at a later stage. Do not provide originals unless you are asked.

About the information you give in this form

The department is authorised to collect information provided on this form under Part 2 of the *Migration Act 1958* (the Act) 'Control of Arrival and Presence of Non-Citizens'. The information provided will be used for assessing your eligibility for a visa to travel, enter and remain in Australia and for other purposes relating to the administration of the Act (for example, to assist migrants with settling in Australia, to monitor the conduct of migration agents, or for ensuring compliance with the Act).

The information provided might also be disclosed to agencies who are authorised to receive information relating to adoption, border control, business skills, citizenship, education, health assessment, health insurance, health services, law enforcement, payment of pensions and benefits, taxation, review of decisions and regulation of migration agents.

The collection, access, storage, use and disclosure by the department of the information you provide in this form is governed by the *Privacy Act 1988* and, in particular, by the 11 Information Privacy Principles. The information form 993i *Safeguarding your personal information*, available from offices of the department, gives details of agencies to which your personal information might be disclosed.

The *Freedom of Information Act 1982* also relates to your personal information. Under this Act, you can apply for access to documents containing your personal information. You or someone authorised to access information on your behalf can apply to do this at any office of the department in Australia. There is no fee for accessing your own information. If you are overseas, you must also provide the Australian mission overseas with an address in Australia to which copies of personal records can be sent. More information on how to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act is given on form 424A *Request for access to documents*.

The department has authority under the *Migration Act 1958* to collect a range of personal identifiers from non-citizens, including visa applicants, in certain circumstances. For more detailed information you should read information form 1243i *Your personal identifying information*, which is available from the department's website www.immi.gov.au/allforms/

Authorisation of a person to receive written communications

You may authorise another person to receive all written communications about your application with the department. That person will be known as your authorised recipient. To do this you will need to complete **Part J Options for receiving written communications** and **Part K Authorised recipient details** in this form. The authorised recipient will need to sign at **Part L Authorised recipient consent**. You can only appoint one authorised recipient at any time. The department will communicate with the most recently appointed authorised recipient.

The department is required under section 494D of the *Migration Act 1958* to send to your authorised recipient any written communications relating to your application that would otherwise have been sent to you. The department will only send to your authorised recipient information which you are entitled to receive. For example, if you are a visa applicant and have a sponsor, your authorised recipient will not receive personal information about your sponsor, unless your sponsor also appointed the same authorised recipient.

If, after you have lodged your application, you decide to withdraw or change the authorised person that you have nominated at **Part K**, you must promptly advise the department in writing of the withdrawal or the details of your new authorised recipient. An authorised recipient can be appointed by either notifying the department in writing or by completing form 1231 *Appointment of authorised recipient*, which is available at offices of the department or from the department's website www.immi.gov.au/allforms/

Authorisation of a migration agent to act on your behalf

If you have a migration agent acting on your behalf in relation to your application you need to complete **Part J Options for receiving written communications** and **Part M Agent details**. The migration agent will need to sign at **Part N Agent consent**.

Appointing a migration agent to act on your behalf includes authorising the department to send to that agent any written communication about your application that would otherwise have been sent to you.

You will be taken to have received any documents sent to that agent as if they had been sent to you.

When you provide details of the migration agent please make sure you give the agent's 7-digit migration agent registration number (MARN) and the agent's full name.

If you change your migration agent or end his/her appointment after you have lodged this application, you must promptly advise the department by using form 956 *Appointment of migration agent*, which is available on the department's website or from your migration agent. You should also notify the agent of this, preferably in writing.

Appointing a migration agent to act on your behalf includes authorising the department to:

- discuss your application with your agent and seek further information via your agent; and
- send to your agent any written communication about your application that would otherwise have been sent to you. This means your migration agent will be your authorised recipient for written communication under section 494D of the *Migration Act 1958* and you will be taken to have received any documents sent to the migration agent as if they were sent to you.

The department will communicate with your agent about your application, including your personal information such as health, police checks, financial viability and personal relationships. If your agent authorises it, this communication may take place by e-mail. The department will only send to your agent information which you are entitled to receive. For example, if you are a visa applicant and have a sponsor, your agent will not receive personal information about your sponsor, unless your sponsor has also appointed the same agent.

In some situations, staff of the department will need to speak with you directly, rather than your migration agent, for example, if you are applying for a visa the department may interview you about your personal circumstances relevant to the visa application. In some situations staff of the department will also send documents to you directly (such as your passport) instead of sending these to your agent, but will inform your agent that it has done so.

If you have appointed a migration agent to act for you, you are still responsible for the accuracy of information and supporting documentation that you provide to your agent so that your agent can provide it to the department.

Using a migration agent

You are not required to use a migration agent. However, if you use a migration agent, the department encourages you to use a registered migration agent. Registered agents are bound by the Migration Agents Code of Conduct, which requires them to act in the lawful best interests of their clients and act professionally.

The MARA investigates complaints against registered agents and may take disciplinary action against them. If you have a concern about a registered agent, you should contact the MARA. A copy of the complaint form is available from the MARA website.

Using an agent exempted from registration

Only registered migration agents can provide 'immigration assistance' for a fee or gift. However, certain people, such as officials, parliamentarians, diplomats, are able to provide immigration assistance as exempted agents so long as they do not receive a fee or gift.

If you wish to appoint an exempted agent, you must complete form 956 *Appointment of migration agent* and attach it to this application form.

The Immigration Advice and Application Assistance Scheme (IAAAS)

Application assistance is provided to eligible applicants and sponsors in Australia to prepare, lodge and present applications for visas. Assistance and advice is funded by the Commonwealth at no cost to the applicant or sponsor and is delivered by service providers throughout Australia. Information on eligibility can be found on the department's Fact sheet 63 *Immigration Advice and Application Assistance Scheme*. The Fact sheet is available at offices of the department or from the department's website.

Consent to communicate electronically

The department may use a range of means to communicate with you. However, electronic means such as fax or e-mail will only be used if you indicate your agreement to receiving communication in this way.

To process your application, the department may need to communicate with you about sensitive information (for example, health, police checks, financial viability and personal relationships). Electronic communications, unless adequately encrypted, are not secure and may be viewed by others or interfered with. If you agree to the department communicating with you by electronic means, the details you provide will only be used by the department for the purpose for which you have provided them, unless there is a legal obligation or necessity to use them for another purpose, or you have consented to use for another purpose. They will not be added to any mailing list.
